## Nature Notes, what to look for in early spring.

March brings the expectation of the arrival of spring. Snowdrops give way to daffodils in our gardens and if you venture into the wider countryside you might be treated by the emergence from hibernation of a sleepy botanist reveling in the sight of a succession of spring flowers. Lesser Celandine is soon joined by the brief appearance of coltsfoot, early violets and primroses. By the beginning of April, you will find sufficient floral diversity to keep you scribbling in your notebook or filling the memory card on your camera.

Frogs and toads return to the ponds, so let's hope that after such a relatively mild winter, that the frenzied spawning of scores of frogs in our garden ponds is commonplace.

If your discipline is birdwatching, then March can often disappoint. Chiffchaffs might break into their disyllabic song by the end of the month, but how many are true spring migrants or of the increasing number of over-wintering birds that have kept shtum until now? Many of the winter visitors will have gone but the Shorteared Owls that wintered within a few miles of our village will often stay until the end of April. Most of Spring migrants don't arrive until April so patience needs to be exercised.

Rippingale and Dowsby Neighbourhood Plan. The Steering Group has now completed the first draft policies of the Plan, which are being reviewed by the consultants. Work on compiling accompanying maps and complementary assessments is complete. Consultation meetings on the Plan with residents and interested groups should have been undertaken in Rippingale and Dowsby and comments noted. It is intended to post the draft Plan on the Village's websites. The next stage is for the completed Plan to be considered by South Kesteven District Council, prior to a local referendum on its adoption. The Plan, when adopted, will be the local document on which future planning applications will be considered and should guide development proposals. **Bus shelters.** The Parish Council is still considering the viability of erecting bus shelters in the village to give some protection from the weather for school children and accompanying adults on school bus days. The Council is minded to support the provision of bus shelters in principle but requires positive input from residents on their thoughts regarding this venture. **Great British Spring Clean.** The Keep Britain Tidy campaign is advertising the need to control litter, much can be achieved by self-help i.e. using litter bins and if you see litter pick it up yourself and deposit it in the appropriate waste bin. I would also highlight that there is now a new dog waste bin on the eastern side of the Jubilee Playing Field, which should be used to deposit dog waste. The litter bin on the playing field should not be used for dog waste.

To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the parish for at least 12 months
