II EW ENTRY & - I Delieve that unchecked development in the 90's increased the size of the village too quickly. Too many people now view the village as a nice place to live, as long as they don't have to do anything to contribute to the social life and fabric of the village. In the 15 years, 1995-2010, households increased by approximately a third and the village lost the majority of it's already sparse facilities, particularly the school. This has meant that villagers with school-age children had no option but to leave the village, which helped, along with the closure of the Post Office, to make the shop a much less viable or profitable business. Both SKDC and LCC have played their part in running down the village through withdrawal of funding for various services, and through poor planning policies, that do not recognise the needs of a rural village **Resident of Rippingale**

ITEM ENTRY 9 - Generally the residents are friendly and happy. There are people that volunteer and participate in the village welfare and are proud of the aspects of living in a small village within a lovely location. I moved from Essex where it was sometimes hostile and unfriendly. I would be happy to help in any way I can.
