In the 15 years, 1995-2010, households increased by approximately a third and the village lost the majority of its already sparse facilities, particularly the school. This has meant that villagers with school-age children had no option but to leave the village, which helped, along with the closure of the Post Office, to make the shop a much less viable or profitable business. Both SKDC and LCC have played their part in running down the village through withdrawal of funding for various services, and through poor planning policies, that do not recognise the needs of a rural village.**
