Nature in and around Rippingale Winter 2019/2020. Hardly a tractor wheel turned in our area from the middle of September throughout the autumn due to the exceptionally wet weather. Yet we have seen some spells of sunshine. In fact, on remembrance Sunday, I watched a Red Admiral butterfly flitting among the gravestones whilst we gathered to remember the fallen.

Winter visitors began to arrive in numbers during October. The thin calls of Redwings, thrushes that breed in Scandinavia could be heard on clearer nights as these birds migrate during the hours of darkness. By day they can be seen devouring the abundant berries of hawthorn and other hedgerow shrubs or maybe feeding on worms and other invertebrates in paddocks. I watched a flock of about 60 birds in Rippingale Fen one morning along with a handful of their much larger cousins; Fieldfares. Continental Blackbirds, Robins, Jays and Goldcrests also augment out resident population of these species.

This morning I watched a female Blackcap in one of our bird baths, We used to think that these warblers were the same birds that nest in our woodlands and gardens but ringing studies have indicated that our birds have continued to migrate south and the birds that winter here probably nested in Germany ad further east.

Less welcome in my garden are the Brown Rats that come in from the fields after harvest and the Grey Squirrels that have honed their ability to destroy my bird feeders. We have also been burdened by sleepy wasps which have found a way in to our house from their beautifully constructed nest in our loft.

Look out for raptors such as Merlin, Hen Harriers and Short-eared Owls. All can be seen on our coast but usually a few find their way to our local fens during the winter months.

Rippingale and Dowsby Neighbourhood Plan. Work by the Steering Group has seen the completion of the drafting of the policies, to form the basis of the Plan. These are with the Consultant for review. They are backed up by supporting maps and necessary discipline assessments. Consultation meetings with residents and interested groups commenced with a presentation to the Business Breakfast club on 21 November. Funding has been received to complete the Plan's implementation process. The Plan, when adopted, will be the local document on which future planning applications will be considered and should guide development proposals.
