## **Parish Council News**

**Bus Shelters.** Thank you for the inputs from the residents who replied with regard to consultation on the desirability of building two bus shelters in the Village. These contributions will be considered by the Parish Council when it reviews the need for these structures.

**Vacancies for Parish Councillors.** There remain vacancies for two Parish Councillors by co-option. These roles are interesting and satisfying. We are looking for volunteers with a wide variety of skills and backgrounds. If you are interested in contributing to the life of the Village, and would like greater information, please contact me. To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months.

**Tennis Court**. The tennis court is available for use by all residents who wish to play there. Please contact me or the Clerk for the entry code. I would ask that after use the gate is locked to ensure that unsanctioned access is denied to unauthorised persons. Additionally, after use, players are requested to lower the net to alleviate tension to avoid damaging the net posts.

**Dogs and the Jubilee Playing Field.** Dogs are banned from the playing field; this sanction was imposed by the Parish Council after consultation with residents and after considering the safety of children, past real dog fouling and the fact that some villagers and children find even controlled dogs frightening. There is signage to impose this restriction. However, it has been noted that some dog owners appear to be unaware of this restriction and are walking their dogs over the field. It is requested that these dog owners respect the restriction, that dogs are not allowed on the playing field.

**Hazardous items on the Jubilee Playing Field.** It has been reported that a sharp object, an arrow, was dropped by the children's play equipment, which if handled, could have injured a child. It is requested that such objects are not taken onto the field.

**Rippingale & District Report of Meeting 2<sup>nd</sup> September 2021.** Our President Rachel was pleased to welcome so many of our members to the first meeting held in the Village Hall since the start of the Covid Pandemic, together with running a Zoom link for those unable to attend in person. We sang Jerusalem to celebrate.

Our speaker, Lorraine Appleton, continued the evening with her presentation entitled 'Don't chuck It, change it'. Lorraine described her background as coming from a 'thrifty' family and aged 8 years was encouraged to make do & mend & received her first sewing machine. This passion encouraged her to take on a career in the fashion industry and become a designer. Her rewards were to have many designs on sale in big stores such as John Lewis & even Harrods.

After some years, Lorraine became concerned about the methods & practices in the fashion industry leading to a 'throw away' culture. Clothes being bought cheaply & the effects on both the planet & the labour force which often worked in dire conditions. Her research found that from 1990, when CO2 emissions were at a more acceptable level, until recently £12.5 billion of clothes are thrown away. Many of these items are now made of mixed fibres which are not recyclable and do not decay easily. The textile industry is second only to the oil industry in pollution of the planet.

As a result of this research, Lorraine successfully took on the challenge to not buy anything new for a year. With her skills she was able to repurpose many items of which she brought many examples. It gave us all food for thought, to look in our wardrobes where, reputedly, £30 billion of clothes hang unworn, quite often with the labels still on them, to re purpose them and help to save the planet.

After the break, Rachel continued with the business side of the meeting. She gave a more formal welcome to our two new members who joined during 'lockdown'& two visitors.

Our Federation put a request out for each WI to make a representational pennant which will eventually become part of bunting, linking all the WIs in the group. Jeannie kindly offered to steer the making of our pennant which has already started.

Pat gave the Treasurers report and advised us that we will have to do some fund raising soon.

Glenys P & Rosemary received birthday cards this month. Raffle prizes went to Rebecca & Beryl. The flower competition was won by Janet, 2<sup>nd</sup> was Chris T & third was Ann G. The monthly competition, something beginning with 'F', was won by Janet M, 2<sup>nd</sup> was Glenys P and 3<sup>rd</sup> was Beryl.
