Bus Shelters. From the results of the consultation with residents through the Newsletter and other inputs, it was clear that the proposal to erect two bus shelters in the Village was not supported. There was not seen to be a need for these expensive facilities (costing approximately £10,000), which would remain unused for the majority of the year, would require annual maintenance, could have a detrimental effect on the Village landscape, whose positioning may hazard safe traffic use and could be potential social nuisance spots. The Parish Council resolved not to take the measure forward.

Grass cutting. As we come to the end of the growing season, I would like to thank the residents who have cut the verges in front of their properties throughout the year. This has assisted in keeping the Village neat and presentable and saved contract costs for grass cutting.

New Parish Councillor. Welcome to Councillor Kimberley Palmer, who has been co-opted onto the Parish Council; we look forward to working with Kim and utilising her wide experience and expertise in taking Council business forward.

Vacancies for Parish Councillors. There are still vacancies for two Parish Councillors by co-option. These roles are stimulating and fulfilling.
