Hospital Car Service. With the impending retirement of Mr Derek Diess, the Hospital Car Service Co-ordinator, there remains a vacancy for the volunteer Co-ordinator. The Co-ordinator undertakes an important role supervising a team of volunteer drivers who provide transport to visit local hospitals, clinics, dentists, etc, for the residents of Rippingale and Dowsby. If you wish to undertake this key duty, please contact the Parish Clerk. The Co-ordinator does not require a driving licence.

Jubilee Playing Field (safety and dogs). As a safety measure the Parish Council has decided to fence off the children's play area, which will for example protect children from uncontrolled dogs. We also intend to apply for a dog exclusion order for this area only. This then brings in question the ban on dogs on the playing field itself. Residents were canvassed a number of years ago regarding allowing dogs on the playing field, which resulted in the banning of dogs on this area. We are minded to revisit this order; therefore, residents are invited to forward their support or not, to allow dogs to be exercised on the playing field. Please forward your comments by email to myself or the Parish Clerk. We will communicate the results of this consultation in due course.

Allotments. The Parish Council maintains a number of allotments near the entrance to the Village off Station Street. These are available for rent to Rippingale residents only, at a reasonable cost. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more detail.

Dog Mess. Unfortunately, there continues to be incidents of a minority of owners allowing their dogs to mess the Villages pavements and other areas. This is illegal, and if proven can lead to a heavy fine. In consideration of other people those dog owners are asked to bag their dog waste and take it home for disposal or place it the SKDC litter bins or the dog mess bin by the playing field.

Grass cutting. The growing season for grass has commenced and the Parish Council has placed its annual contract for cutting the public areas. Residents who have in the past cut the verges without a public pavement in front of their properties are asked to undertake this task again this year.

Community Policing - Just today, I received a text message from an unknown number telling me that I had been in contact with someone who had tested positive for the 'Omicron Varient'. The text message was from an unknown mobile number and urged me to apply for an 'urgent' test kit by clicking on a link. A couple of clues to the fact it was a fraud? Unknown number, no NHS reference to Track and Trace, and they spelt 'variant' wrong! However, these people are getting more and more plausible, and it is so easy to be conned. I did not click on the link but I am sure that if I had have done, it would have involved putting in my bank details. Never EVER give your bank details over the phone, via text or online to any person or organisation that asks you for them. They may say that they are from the NHS, or your bank or a similarly believable contact, but none of these will ever ask you for your bank details or credit card numbers. An example would be an 'excess postage request' from 'Royal Mail' or import/export/delivery companies. You can protect yourself from these unscrupulous, faceless criminals in many ways. I thought it might be a good idea to provide some links to organisations that can give you further info and updates on crime in our area so that we can all be wiser to scammers and stay safe. As Police Forum Liaison on the Rippingale Parish Council, please feel free to get in touch if you have particular crime and safety issues that you would like to see addressed.
