Newark Sportive 100

Four members of the Rippingale Riders, who's total ages exceed 280 years, are embarking on a 100-mile marathon cycle in just 8 hours. Phil Ward, Jonathan Newell, Chas Mayhew & John Kimbrey will set off just after 08.00 on Sunday 15th May.

The route leaves Newark and heads south, then east before reaching the first food stop at 48 miles at the village hall in, yes, you've guessed it, Rippingale. The route then heads into the fens, before turning north to Heckington and Ruskington, before the last thirty miles back to Newark. If they keep to schedule, they should arrive at the village hall around mid-day, where a welcome break of just fifteen minutes will allow them to adjust their lycra, ease their stiffness and grab some fuel, before heading off towards Dowsby.

A twelve-week training programme has been underway since February, achieving over 160 miles per week at the peak, with total training mileage exceeding 1250 miles. For interest, that is the same distance cycling from Rippingale to Land's End and then to John o' Groats...

Some of the chaps are raising money for charity too, and your support would be most appreciated. Details of their training progress and of each charity, will be published in next month's Rippingale news, but can already be found on the village notice board at the church and in the Bull. If you wish to support your local villagers on this difficult challenge, either with a financial donation or just providing your encouragement on the day, it will be greatly appreciated.

Return of the Swifts. It's that time of year again !! If you were part of the swift box project set up by Nick Williams in 2019 please can you remember to switch on the call music from about mid May onwards.

Swifts arrive in three waves, the first is the established breeding birds who will have a nest site; the second wave are the ones you are after, these are next year's breeders looking for a nest site to call their own; swifts are absolutely site faithful. The final wave are last year's chicks.

Without driving your neighbours crackers the music should be on as much as possible but at least from 8am – 11am and 6pm -9pm and if you can squeeze in an afternoon slot of 2pm -4pm all the better. Any queries please telephone Kate on 07983 624580.

Hospital Car Service. With the impending retirement of Mr Derek Diess, the Hospital Car Service Co-ordinator, there still remains a vacancy for the volunteer Co-ordinator. The Co-ordinator undertakes an important role supervising a team of volunteer drivers who provide transport to visit local hospitals, clinics, dentists, etc, for the residents of Rippingale and Dowsby. If you wish to undertake this key duty, please contact the Parish Clerk. The Co-ordinator does not require a driving licence.

Jubilee Playing Field (safety and dogs). The results of the consultation on allowing dogs on the playing field resulted in a majority of residents wishing dogs to be permitted to exercise there. The Parish Council noted this and agreed to a six-month trial of allowing dogs on the playing field, commencing once the fencing had been erected around the children's play equipment. **This is expected to be at the end of June.** It was also agreed to place further dog waste bins at the entrances to the field, with appropriate signage on dog control. Further details will be communicated.

Community Chest. As a result of Her Majesty's the Queen's Diamond Jubilee celebrations in 2012 in the Village, the committee which organised the events generated a surplus fund of £542-17p. They decided this should form a Community Chest ringfenced within the Parish Council's accounts, to be utilised by a suitable project. This fund was discussed at the last Parish Council meeting, with a view to using it to assist in commemorating the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, through the purchase on a commemoration bench.
