Approximately two hundred people attended the Beacon Lighting on Thursday 2<sup>nd</sup> June, enjoying refreshments and seeing a text-book perfect lighting... a big relief all round!

The Dog Show on Friday was very well supported with 37 dogs entering a variety of classes. It proved to be a light-hearted event for both owners and on-lookers.

Feast Day itself dawned with final preparations across all the areas – we were lucky to have good weather, which meant many people came up to the field to enjoy the day, including the Spitfire fly-past.

**Hospital Car Service.** There remains a vacancy for the Hospital Car Service Co-ordinator. The Co-ordinator undertakes an important role supervising a team of volunteer drivers who provide transport to visit local hospitals, clinics, dentists, etc, for the residents of Rippingale and Dowsby. If you wish to undertake this key duty, please contact the Parish Clerk. The Co-ordinator does not require a driving licence.

**Neighbourhood Plan.** Work on the pre submission documents is complete, and these and the final draft Plan have been forwarded to SKDC for their appraisal and further Village consultation, prior the Plan's formal inspection and an eventual Village referendum on the Plan.

**Feast**. The Parish Council passes on its great thanks to the Feast Committee for its efforts and their volunteers, in organising a highly successful programme of events to celebrate the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, which encompassed the Beacon lighting, Dog Show and Fete. They and their volunteers ensured that the Village had an impressive community festival, which engendered terrific community engagement.

**Future project.** The portacabin on the Playing Field has been used for many years to support Village community and sports events and act as a storage resource. However, it has fallen into disrepair and is nearing the end of its useful life. The Parish Council has decided to commence a fund-raising exercise to replace it. We have commenced approaching various granting making bodies to assist in funding this project and will explore local fund-raising activities. An envisaged new building is detailed below the latest planning applications. Any comments on this, assistance with fund raising and general support will be welcomed.


