Guitar, Mandolin 5 string banjo and bass guitar soon followed and by the age of 14 Ian was performing as a regular on the local music scene playing anywhere from pubs to theatres as a multi-instrumentalist.

A sought-after session musician he has managed to have been a part of most genres of the music and entertainment industry enabling him to have played at some of the most prestigious venues in the land with some of the top names in the business.

Accessibility in Rippingale. In the last Newsletter I asked residents of the village to let me know of any problems that they have encountered with regards to Accessibility in the village. I have had several responses which have highlighted several areas that are causing problems. The issue with pavements is to be taken up with Lincolnshire County Council and SKDC and may take some time to resolve, but there are other areas where residents can help.

One of the problems noticed, is parking. Often, drivers park on the pavement. This causes problems for all pedestrians and means that the footpath is effectively blocked. The only alternative is to walk in the road. The simple solution is for drivers to park on the road, without mounting the pavement and help ensure that the pavements are clear for pedestrians.

If your property has trees, bushes or undergrowth which are protruding onto the footpath you can help to improve accessibility for everyone by cutting these back so that the footpath past your property is clear. This would go a long way to help making the village easy to manoeuvre around for those in wheelchairs, on mobility scooters, pushing prams and buggies and others with mobility issues.

I hope that by taking these simple actions, we can make Rippingale safer for all pedestrians and I thank you for your support. Kate Manley

Allotments. The Parish Council administers the Village's allotments, off Station Road. There are a number of vacant allotment plots available to rent for a reasonable annual charge. There is a thriving Allotment Association who can provide gardening advice and support. If you wish to rent a plot, please contact the Parish Clerk.

Neighbourhood Plan. SKDC have received all necessary Regulation 16 documents, required for formal inspection by SKDC and the Independent Assessor. An experienced Assessor has been recommended by SKDC, who has a vast familiarity inspecting Neighbourhood Plans. No objections were raised against him and SKDC were to be informed that the Parish Council saw him as a suitable independent assessor. We look forward to a final six-week public consultation and eventually a local referendum on the Plan's proposals.

The Pinfold. This historic enclosure at the junction of the Dovecot and Station Street is evidence of a medieval practice of corralling stray livestock and is a registered listed structure. It is clear that there seem to have been a couple of incidents of damage to the pinfold. This appears to be by young people and malicious and such a pity that a piece of the Village's history is being treated so badly, which will require a costly repair. If you see such incidents, please ring 101 and report anti-social behaviour to the Police. I would counsel parents to speak to their children about behaving responsibly when out and about in the Village.


