**Church Sun-Dial.** It has taken almost three months, but after a complete re-build, the new sun dial will be fixed back in place before Christmas. It was undertaken by a volunteer from the village, at his own expense and should now last another decade or two, before further work is needed.

The original was placed high on the south wall of the church in 1793, and almost 230 years later, the next in a line now will overlook the churchyard for many years to come, even if we can't guarantee the time will always be strictly accurate. But then, we have the church clocks to put us right...
