New Pavilion for the Playing Field. The Parish Council with the Jubilee Playing Field Trust is taking forward a project to provide a new Pavilion. This will result in a purpose-built facility to support sports and village events, plus allowing the Feast to have a centre. We have commenced fundraising with some success but need to broaden our fundraising base.

In the light of recent events reported in the press please see the below the letter from our Rector sent to all PCC's in our Group.

Dear All,

I have now received several Emails & phone calls in relation to the announcement by the C of E that there will be a £100m fund in partial reparation for the church's links to transatlantic chattel slavery.

Many of these comments object on the grounds that this is a time when diocesan finances are under pressure and other savings/cuts are being made.

The printed link gives more detail.

It appears that this £100m fund relates to endowments directly linked to/resulting from involvement in the slave trade, a practice that according to an 'expert' on the radio this morning benefitted the church to the present-day equivalent of £1billion.

So, it could be viewed, and is by some groups, that all the church is doing is giving back a small amount of what it should never have taken in the first place. This raises many interesting moral questions.

It is also important to note that, although we may not agree with it, there is a complex financial relationship between the church commissioners and the diocesan financial systems and not a simple 'what one has the other can spend'.

Anyway, please read up on this matter so that we are all fully informed (or as well informed as we can be) to discuss these items when raised.

As part of the effort to raise funds for St Andrew's Church, Ian Misselbrook is carrying out a sponsored birdwatch during 2023. He is aiming to reach the following targets by the end of the year; - 200 different birds in the British Isles, 120 birds in Lincolnshire and 70 birds in the combined parishes (Rippingale, Kirkby Underwood, Dunsby, Haconby and Morton). He is asking that you pick one or more of his target categories and sponsor him an amount per bird species. You can also specify to cap your donation. For example, if you choose the Lincolnshire category and sponsor £0.02 per bird, if he reaches his target of 120 birds your donation would be £2.40, but you could choose to cap it at any amount that you like.
