Update on Ian Misselbrook's Sponsored Birdwatch for St Andrew's Church.

Many thanks to all those of you who have sponsored me and for those of you who have not yet, you still have time! You might remember that there was a choice of three categories of sponsorship; the combined parishes looked after by our vicar, Lincolnshire and lastly the UK. As you can see below, at the time of writing (8th of May) I have exceeded the targets for both the parishes and the county of Lincolnshire, but I still have some way to go to get to the UK target.

If you sponsored me for either the parishes or the county, I am happy to receive your donation now, or alternatively I can wait until the end of the year when I finish the count.

Recent highlights in the parishes include a nesting pair of Little Grebes and the expected arrival of summer migrants. The Lincolnshire list includes several national rarities including Blue-winged Teal and Black-winged Stilts. A brief trip to the Scottish Highlands failed to secure many of my target species but I did find Crested Tits and Ring Ouzels for the UK category.

St Andrew's Church Rippingale Change to Type 4 Festival

This is to communicate that the PC has made the decision to change the status of St Andrew's Church, Rippingale, from a Type 3 Community Church to a type 4 Festival Church with immediate effect. The definition of a festival church was communicated by Lincoln Diocese as: Nationally and locally defined as Celebration or Festival Churches. Churches which remain as places of worship, but which cannot or do not wish to offer regular worship. They can be used for Festival or Celebration events - occasional services at, say, Harvest and

Christmas. Also places for the spiritual and shared journeys of residents - weddings and funerals.

- What are the implications and how will this be applied at Rippingale?
 - The Church will remain under the control of the PCC, be part of the Rippingale community and as such we would wish to change as little as possible. We encourage parishioners and villagers to continue to provide valuable support, both financial and physical to enable the Church to remain a key feature of our village and available for activities outlined below.
 - The Church will be open during daytime at weekends but will be closed during the rest of the week, this will apply throughout the year.

Coffee Mornings currently held each first Tuesday of the month at 10.15am at the Church WILL CONTINUE as now.

- The Church will be available for special services such as Weddings, Funerals and Baptisms.
 Festival services may be held during the year, these may include: Plough Sunday, Easter, Rippingale Feast Service, Harvest, Remembrance, and Christmas - the type and regularity of services will depend on both the wishes of parishioners and the availability of Clergy/ALMs/ to hold/host the services. Some prayer meetings may be held with no formal church ministers required.
- The Church will continue to hold Fund Raising events such as Quizzes, Feast Stalls, and other Social Events from time to time in order to raise funds primarily for the upkeep and repair and maintenance of the Church Building and Grounds.
- o The 200 Club will continue.
- The PCC will continue to be responsible for the Church as it's Trustees and stay in situ and manage the day-to-day requirements of the Church and Churchyard/Cemetery as well as the necessary work related to the Services that we do hold.
- Regular Sunday Church Services such as Evensong and Eucharists will no longer be held at St Andrew's Rippingale except on special occasions as noted above. Parishioners wishing to attend a Sunday Service, including Eucharist, will be able to do so by going to other local churches in the local mission partnership, information on these services will continue to be published via local publications and social media, as now.

Retiring Parish Councillors. Alan Vaughan and Kim Palmer have for various understandable personal reasons decided to leave the Parish Council. We thank them both for their great contributions to the work of the Council and wish them well for the future.

Vacancy for Parish Councillors. This are two vacancies for Parish Councillors by co-option. This role is stimulating and fulfilling. We are seeking volunteers with a wide variety of skills and background. If you are interested in contributing to supporting the Village, and would like greater information, please contact me. To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months.

Hospital Car Service. The HCS relies on volunteer drivers to effectively run the system and transport patients to their medical appointments. For various reasons the HCS now requires replacement volunteer drivers to efficiently administer the service. Drivers, who need to be properly insured, are fully recompensed with a 65p a mile allowance. If you have the spare time and wish to volunteer for this very worthwhile support role, please contact the scheme administrator, Chris Ross, on 07806 327362.

Referendum on Rippingale Neighbourhood Plan 2023-2036. Hearteningly the Neighbourhood Plan to influence village housing development has recently passed its Village referendum by a large margin, 249 for and 27 against. SKDC should now commence using the Plan as part of the process to assess planning applications in the Village.

Grass cutting. The growing season for grass has commenced and the Parish Council has placed its annual contract for cutting the public areas. Residents who have in the past cut the verges without a public pavement in front of their properties are asked to undertake this task again this year.

Springwells Medical Practice – Medical Equipment Fund (Registered Charity). This fund is looking for Ambassadors for each Village the Practice supports, to assist in fundraising and disseminating information regarding events, health matters etc. The Ambassadors would set up a support team in each Village to further this. Allotments. The Parish Council maintains a number of allotments near the entrance to the Village off Station Street. These are available for rent to Rippingale residents only, at a reasonable cost. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more detail.

New Pavilion for the Playing Field. The Parish Council with the Jubilee Playing Field Trust, is taking forward a project to provide a new Pavilion. This will result in a purpose-built facility to support sports and village events, plus allowing the Feast to have a centre. We have commenced fundraising with some success and continue to apply to grant making bodies to raise funds.
