Rippingale Feast 2023. The Feast Committee would like to express their gratitude to our village and surrounding area for their whole-hearted support in making the Feast weekend such a wonderful community occasion. Despite the weather The Dog Show on Friday was a lovely (and lively) event, with 27 dogs entering a variety of classes, on the Jubilee Playing Field. Winning dogs won rosettes, whilst their owners enjoyed a drink and a hot pie. Huge thanks to 'What the Dog Wants' for sponsoring the Dog Show.

Feast Day itself started early with final preparations across all the areas – good weather meant many people came up to the field to enjoy the day, including the earlier than expected Lancaster fly-past. Soren Grew, this year's Rose Royal, looking splendid in his crown and cloak, arrived on a trailer to declare the Feast open. The crowd was entertained by a wide variety of local acts, including The Tuneless Choir, Folkingham Ukulele Group, Bourne Judo Club, The Sonics, The Digby Military Wives Choir, and dance troupe, LDC. Again, the Competitions tent attracted entries across a variety of classes. A range of stallholders offered their crafts for sale, whilst the children enjoyed the bale pit, penalty shoot-out, soft play and face painting to name a few! We are extremely grateful to all the volunteers who gave up much time to help set up and dismantle the marquees, to man the various stalls - the tea tent and the barbeque were both extremely popular- and generally enable the Feast to flourish. Thanks also to Brian of the New Inn, Folkingham, for running the bar so efficiently.

In The Grand Draw five of the six monetary prizes, including first prize, went to Rippingale residents, along with the beautiful bag donated by Bobby's Bags. Thanks to all who bought raffle tickets as this remains the key fund-raiser for the Feast.

The Thanksgiving Service in the Church on Sunday afternoon was a fitting end to weekend's festivities and gave an opportunity for Soren to be presented with a book as a memento.

All in all, we are thrilled that so many people have given such positive feedback on the weekend; it was a lovely village event. We hope that some of you will come forward to join the group of volunteers or the Committee as the Feast goes forward. Sadly, the current Committee have decided not to continue in their roles, due to other commitments, and therefore a new band of Committee members is required. The 'old' Committee have amassed a wealth of experience since 2019 and will be very happy to offer advice and help, if needed.

The AGM of the Feast Committee was held in St Andrew's Church on Monday 10 July at 7pm at which the outgoing Committee announced that, in line with their Constitution, they would be donating £3000 to the village's Pavilion project, whilst leaving a very healthy balance in the Feast funds for 2024. **Thank you all for your support – we couldn't have done it without you!**

Report For 6th July 2023 for Rippingale & District W.I. After a warm welcome to both members & Mel, a visitor, Rebecca handed over to Justin an Officer from the Cyber Crime Unit for Lincolnshire Police who was our speaker for the evening. To start, he asked us a few questions to establish how many of us use Smart phones & Computers etc. He then asked how careful we thought we were about the passwords that we must use for this technology. It soon became apparent, with the aid of a power point presentation and a few related videos, that perhaps we weren't as secure as we thought.

Justin then explained why we are at risk. All personal & financial data has a value to criminals. If they get a hold of this information, it can be used either for them to create a scam or to sell on to another criminal. Weak passwords can be worked out in the matter of moments. The Crime Unit recommends using three completely random words with perhaps a character included. An example would be 'BlueJ@mDance'. This type of example would take a very long time to 'crack'. Our emails are a good place for hackers to start, as they could contain information about you. So, it is recommended that your email password is completely different to any others you use. It could, therefore, be difficult to remember all the different passwords in use. Most internet browsers will often give you the option to save your passwords which are encrypted for safety. It is also highly recommended that you update your devices regularly as these often include upgrades to security. Also recommended is a process for extra protection called 'two-factor authentication' which simply means you will be prompted for a second piece of information when signing into an account. Usually, a code which will be sent via text or email. For further information on how to get secure online, visit 'cyberaware.gov.uk'

Feast Day 1st July 2023 – huge thanks must be given to the Feast Committee for organising and executing such a successful Feast Day 1st July 2023 and the associated Dog Show on 30th June 2023. This all reflected so well on the very hard work the Committee carried out over the previous year and volunteers nearer and on the day. The Committee having been in post for 3 years have decided to stand down. If you consider that you can contribute and serve on a new Committee for Feast 2024, please contact me for details.

Vacancy for Parish Councillors. There remains one vacancy for a Parish Councillor by co-option. This role is stimulating and fulfilling. We are seeking a volunteer with a wide variety of skills and background. If you are interested in contributing to supporting the Village, and would like greater information, please contact me. To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months.

Hospital Car Service. The HCS relies on volunteer drivers to effectively run the system and transport patients to their medical appointments. For various reasons the HCS now requires replacement volunteer drivers to efficiently administer the service. Drivers, who need to be properly insured, are fully recompensed with a 65p a mile allowance. If you have the spare time and wish to volunteer for this very worthwhile support role, please contact the scheme administrator, Chris Ross, on 07806 327362.

Allotments. The Parish Council maintains a number of allotments near the entrance to the Village off Station Street. These are available for rent to Rippingale residents only, at a reasonable cost. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more detail.

Safe traffic speed. It has been reported that some residents may be failing to take account of road considerations when traveling by car through the village. Although the legal speed limit in the village is 30mph, drivers are asked to take care and reduce speed when approaching junctions and bends, to allow for vehicles which may be emerging from these points.

Mass marketing fraud- what you can do to prevent it. Mass marketing fraud is when you receive uninvited contact by email, letter, phone, or adverts, asking for money. Many are lured by the prospect of a surprise win and give large amounts of money or personal data to claim their fake prize. Common mass-marketing scams include:

- Foreign lotteries and sweepstakes/prize draws
- Charity scams
- Romance scams

It can also involve fraudsters pretending to sell something without giving anything in return. As a general rule:

- You can't win money or a prize in a lottery you haven't entered.
- You can't be 'chosen at random' from a list you didn't sign up to
- You should never have to pay a fee or make a purchase to claim a legitimate prize.
