**New Parish Councillor.** We welcome Mrs Nicky Donley as a new Parish Councillor. Nicky has lived in the Village for over 20 years and has a wide range of managerial and administrative skills and experience which will prove beneficial in discharging her duties on the Council.

**Vacancy for Parish Councillors.** There remains one vacancy for a Parish Councillor by co-option. This role is stimulating and fulfilling. To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months.

**Hospital Car Service.** The HCS relies on volunteer drivers to effectively run the system and transport patients to their medical appointments. For various reasons the HCS now requires replacement volunteer drivers to efficiently administer the service. Drivers, who need to be properly insured, are fully recompensed with a 65p a mile allowance. If you have the spare time and wish to volunteer for this very worthwhile support role, please contact the scheme administrator, Chris Ross, on 07806 327362.

**Allotments.** The Parish Council maintains a number of allotments near the entrance to the Village off Station Street. These are available for rent to Rippingale residents only, at a reasonable cost. Please contact the Parish Clerk for more detail.

Village road closures. The following roads will be closed within the Parish in September:

- Fen Road/Long Drove (Between 500m & 1100m East of B1177) 07/09/2023 18/09/2023 for quick line cabling & track laying by Opals Group. Restrictions to be implemented for 12 days as and when required during this period, signage detailing accurate dates and times will be displayed on site in advance. Diversion routes and vehicular or pedestrian access arrangements will be signposted. Contact the LCC Customer Service Centre on 01522 782070 if further information required.
- Doctor's Lane (Between East Street & a point 450m South) 18/09/2023 22/09/2023 for cable reinforcement for new services by National Grid Electricity. Restrictions to be implemented for 5 days as and when required during this period, signage detailing accurate dates and times will be displayed on site in advance. Diversion routes and vehicular or pedestrian access arrangements will be signposted. Contact the LCC Customer Service Centre on 01522 782070 if further information required.


