<u>Tesco Bags of Help Grant Scheme</u> – Rippingale Playing Field equipment project. The Rippingale Replace Recreational Equipment and Supply Adult Fitness Equipment appeal has been chosen as a project to be voted on by Tesco customers in the following stores from Friday 1st March 2019 to Tuesday 30th April 2019:

Our project along with the other two successful projects in our region will go forward to a vote in these Tesco stores where their customers will decide the outcome by voting for their favourite project each time they shop. The project with the highest number of votes will receive £4,000 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), the second placed project £2,000 (or the amount that was requested up to this value), and the third placed project £1,000.

I would ask that that Tesco customers support Rippingale's cause to replace our outdated and worn play equipment and also provide adult fitness equipment. New equipment would enhance Rippingale's and other local villages' residents' recreational and health options, providing social cohesion and enhance village life.

<u>Aveland Neighbourhood Plan.</u> I can highlight further progress by the working group. A meeting held on 6th February 2019 reviewed the draft neighbourhood profile assessment for Rippingale and Dowsby which had been produced after much effort. The assessment should shortly be finalised, and it is an important work strand to assist the production of the Neighbourhood Plan. Please see the Village website for information. Rubbish Dumps and Fires. Dumping of waste on land adjacent to neighbours can be unsightly and may pose an environment threat. There can be intervention by SKDC to ensure such waste is removed. The lighting of fires to dispose of such waste can cause irritating smoke, which can affect health and also affect washing line drying. It is illegal to burn waste, other than natural materials, as such waste can produce toxic smoke, prosecution can result. It is better to utilise the waste disposal facilities in Bourne or a builder's skip if required. Please be mindful of other villagers when considering waste disposal.

<u>Councillor Vacancy.</u> There is at time of writing a councillor vacancy. Due to the planned local elections in May, the vacancy will be filled through Co-option. If you are interested in making a difference in YOUR village, the formal Vacancy Notice will be published on the Village website and Parish Council Noticeboard later this month. To be eligible, you must be aged over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months.
