Budget and Precept for the Financial Year 2019/2020.

The Council has now set its budget for the next financial year. It has been decided to keep the Precept at its current level for the third year running. From this we will fund our running costs and village maintenance, meet the grass and hedge cutting contract and look to assist with upgrading the play equipment on the Jubilee Playing Field. Details will be posted on the Village noticeboard and website.

Churchyard refurbishment.

Purchase of the new lampposts for erection in the churchyard has been undertaken. On reassessing the financial programme, it has been decided to commence the fitting of the lampposts as soon as weather and ground conditions allow.

Aveland Neighbourhood Plan.

I can highlight further progress by the working group. At a meeting held on 16 January it was reported that the production of the neighbourhood profile assessment for Rippingale and Dowsby should shortly be completed. An open space and community facilities report for Rippingale had been finished. We are currently considering public consultation meetings. The next meeting of the working group is planned on 20 February 2019. Please see the Village website for information. Councillor Departure.

Understandably, due to family and other commitments, Julie Parry has had to resign from the Parish Council and will depart in February. The Council are most grateful for Julie's drive and enthusiasm during her tenure as a Councillor and thank her for pushing issues forward. We wish her well for the future.

Vacancy.

Julie's impending departure means there will soon be a councillor vacancy. Due to the planned local elections in May, the vacancy will be filled through Co-option. If you are interested in making a difference in YOUR village, the formal Vacancy Notice will be published on the Village website and Parish Council Noticeboard later this month. To be eligible, you must be aged over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the Parish for at least 12 months. Highways walkabout.

Lincolnshire County Council have agreed on 27 February that a highways officer, in company with some Parish Councillors, will inspect the roads within the village.
