Two displays have been erected to commemorate this year's Remembrance Day, but in particular the 100th year since the end of WW1. The first is a static display in the corner of the church, depicting a soldier standing in thought, surrounded by poppies and the Union flag. The second is more poignant, with a small reconstruction of a corner of a British trench in war torn France, at the entrance to the village. Aveland Neighbourhood Plan. We are currently in the process of rejuvenating the Aveland Neighbourhood Plan as we are keen to influence and shape future developments in our communities. As part of the work we need to undertake a Neighbourhood Profile. The profile will involve the identification of areas, buildings, features, views, and building styles whose character we wish to protect. This will be carried out for Rippingale and the immediate surrounding countryside and requires the knowledge and opinions of village residents. We need small teams to collect and collate the information required for the report. The composition of each team should be representative of different areas of the village. We will therefore hold a meeting in Rippingale Parish church on 17th November 2018 at 10.00am to undertake this task. A full briefing on the areas to be covered will be given. This will also involve village walks to survey the areas to be assessed. It is anticipated that this task will take four hours. If you can assist in anyway, please try to attend that meeting. If you are unable to attend but wish to assist in the process to complete the Neighbourhood Plan, please contact Mike Hallas Project Manager on 01778 440804 or me. He and I can also be contacted with any queries.

Commemoration of the end of WW1. A small mock-up of a WW1 battlefield has been erected on the approach to the village, as a memorial to the end of WW1 and to mark the sacrifice of those who died and were scarred by the conflict. It will be in place in the period up to 11 November, on which day we will commemorate Remembrance Sunday in the Church and at the village war memorial. Lest we forget.
