Councillor Farewell

Unfortunately, due to work and family commitments, Mike Exton has resigned from the Parish Council. The Council are sad to lose Mike and thank him for his efforts and his great support during his many years as a Councillor and wish him well for the future.

Vacancies

Mike's departure means that there are currently two councillor vacancies. The original vacancy can be filled through co-option directly with the Parish Council. An election to fill the second vacancy will be held on receipt of a request in writing from any ten Rippingale local government electors to the SKDC Returning Officer by 3 September. If no such request is received, the vacancy will be filled through Co-option by the Parish Council. Full details are published in the Vacancy Notices on the Village website and Parish Council Noticeboard. If you are interested in making a difference in YOUR village, and would like greater information, please contact any Councillor or the Clerk. To be eligible, you must be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the parish for at least 12 months.

St Andrew's Churchyard Maintenance

After due consideration by the Parish Council it has been decided that the maintenance of the Churchyard be passed to South Kesteven District Council, who will commence grass cutting and other tasks later in the year. The Parish Council will liaise with SKDC, the Parochial Church Council and the Diocese, to ensure that the Churchyard remains a worthy Village centrepiece. In that vein, we are continuing to take forward the purchase through sponsorship of new lampposts for the Churchyard; they should hopefully be erected shortly after Diocese approval.

Jubilee Playing Field

Tennis Court - To try and maximise the use of the court throughout the summer holidays, the tennis net has been left installed at the court; please release the net tension after use. Access to the court is still via a coded padlock. The code can be issued to anyone on the electoral register; visitors will need to be sponsored by a resident.

Dogs – the playing field is a signposted designated dog free zone, as it an area where children play. Additionally, in the past dog waste has been left there. There have been reports of dogs being allowed on the field. Please cease this practice or we will be forced to take necessary action against the individuals involved.
