Rippingale Village Feast 2018 – FEAST DAY

Our fears were unfounded as we had a steady stream of visitors throughout the afternoon and we were very pleased to see so many familiar, friendly faces. We were delighted to be able to introduce our new Rose Queen, Taisie Warcup, to the village and were impressed by her confident public speaking and poise. Generally, everything went according to plan, we were treated to a great Flypast from the BBMF Hurricane, and it was a wonderful Community day. Our grateful thanks to all those who gave us their time and services before, on, and after the Feast afternoon! The weekend closed with the traditional, well-attended, Feast church service at 4.00pm on the Sunday, where the Rose Queen was presented with her Rose Bowl.

Rippingale Village Feast - GRAND DRAW RESULTS

The Rippingale 2018 Feast Grand Draw winning tickets were drawn during the afternoon of the Feast on Saturday 7th July. Unusually, the 1st and 2nd prizes, of £250 and £150 respectively, were won by the same persons. On the condition that they remain anonymous, they have donated the £400 to the St. Andrew's Church roof restoration fund. The 3rd prize, of £100, was won by Keith, of Queen's Court, Bourne. Churchyard Lamp Post Sponsorship

The Council has been overwhelmed with the promised (and some already received) sponsorship donations to help improve the safety of the Churchyard through additional lighting that will also serve as a legacy for parishioners. We are uncertain of the timescale to install the additional lights at the time of writing, as we are waiting for confirmation from the Archdeacon on whether a Faculty is required; we are hopeful that the replacement of the existing lamp post will be completed very soon, using the first of the sponsorship funds.

Don't forget – Councillor Vacancy

There is still a vacancy for one councillor, which the Council is looking to fill through Co-option. To be eligible you need to be over 18, on the electoral role and have lived or worked within 3 miles of the parish for at least 12 months. If you have a keen interest in making a difference in YOUR village, please contact any Councillor or the Clerk.

Jubilee Playing Field - Play Equipment Project Update

Even though you may not be seeing any changes on the ground, the work to realise a much improved is continuing. To maximise what can be achieved and minimise the financial impact on the Parish, we are applying for Grant Funding from a number of sources. Cllr Parry is still sourcing more 'like for like' quotes on the equipment requirement from a number of different companies. To give you an idea of what we would like to achieve, an example layout is available on the website and Noticeboard. Please remember that this is just one example based on the requirement compiled from residents' surveyed responses, not all of this may be possible due to costs, and the items and layout may change.

Overgrown Hedges & Footpaths

Within the Parish if your property or a field adjoins a public footpath, pavement or road, please could you ensure that these public rights of way are not obstructed by any overgrown shrubbery or hedging; you have a responsibility to clear this. Depending on the pavement or road, the responsibility for enforcement could lie with the County or District Council; we do try and contact you first to let you know what needs addressing. If the 'cross county footpaths' are overgrown, these need to be reported direct to the Countryside Services: www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/countryside/ or via 01522 702080.

Fault Reporting - Fix My Street

Following issues with the Highways Fault Reporting System they are now recommending that faults and issues are reported using www.fixmystreet.com The advantage of using this system is that you can still pinpoint the issues on a map, see other reported faults, and get an email to check you've had an update. You can still report issues direct to LCC (and SKDC) using the 'Report it' tab on the respective websites: www.lincolnshire.gov.uk or www.southkesteven.gov.uk If you don't have access to the internet, faults can still be reported to LCC on 01522 782070 or SKDC on 01476 406080 (590044 for out of hours/emergency).
