#### **Councillor Farewell**

Sadly, busy work commitments have meant that Bev Machin has resigned from the Parish Council. Throughout her tenure, Bev has been an active Member as Councillor, Chairman and latterly Vice Chairman, and fulfilled a liaison role with the Feast Organising Committee. I'm sure you will join the Council, in thanking Bev for her contribution to the Council and Rippingale community and wish her well for the future.

## **Councillor Vacancy**

Bev's resignation means that there is a now a councillor vacancy. An election to fill the vacancy will be held on receipt of a request in writing from any ten Rippingale local government electors to the South Kesteven District Council Returning Officer by 4 May. If no such request is made the vacancy will be filled through cooption by the Parish Council. The full vacancy Notice is published on the website and Noticeboard.

## **Verge & Roadside Grass Cutting**

Lincolnshire County Council (LCC) has confirmed that it will be carrying out 2 verge cuts at the entrances to the Village during the 2018 season, which are due to take place in mid-late May and October. As with last season, the Parish Council is again asking you to maintain the verges adjacent to your property. To help ensure residents stay safe whilst maintaining these areas, the County Council has issued the following advice:

- pick a quiet time when there is less traffic
- wear a high-vis jacket and face oncoming traffic when at the edge of the road
- check for utility covers, hidden holes and loose stones
- stop mowing when people are passing
- do not cut grass when it's wet, if it's raining or visibility is poor
- do not use strimmers
- if the site is sloping: mow across with a push mower & up and down if using a ride-on mower
- dispose of any grass cuttings in an appropriate manner.

Neither LCC nor the Parish Council cannot accept any liability for issues which occur, but you may have personal liability cover as part of your personal insurance policies. Overgrown grass and hedges can be reported to LCC via <a href="www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/faultreporting">www.lincolnshire.gov.uk/faultreporting</a>; please be aware LCC will only take action if the issue poses a risk to public safety.
